The Faculty of Social Sciences and the Swiss Center at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem are now offering an exclusive graduate degree program in conflict resolution **taught in English** over two semesters.

The program explores methods, techniques and strategies used to manage and resolve conflicts from different disciplinary points of view including international relations, law, political science, social psychology, communication, media studies and sociology.

## Master of Arts in CONFLICT RESEARCH, MANAGEMENT, AND RESOLUTION A Multidisciplinary Program (taught in English)

**Study** with leading local and international experts.

**Acquire** skills for managing and resolving conflicts on a global scale.

**Learn** about the multitude of narratives in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the ongoing dialogue and contestation between different communities and culture through a series of workshops and tours.

**Come to Jerusalem** to learn **first-hand** about the conflict, about the rich stories and traditions of Jerusalem, and about the complex realities of a society in conflict.

Courses include the following:

- \* Effective negotiation: From theory to practice.
- \* Workshop in conflict management and resolution.
- \* Cyber security: Global and local technology, policy and politics.
- \* Transitional justice: In politics, societies and media.
- \* The Holocaust, collective memory and visual culture .
- \* Dialogue, narratives and identities in conflict .
- \* The Israeli society as a society in conflict: Psychological and social aspects.
- \* Propaganda, persuasion and attitude change in political and social conflicts.
- \* Another journey: learning about conflict and diversity.

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The program includes study tours: students will meet with different communities and learn first-hand about their cultures and traditions. Tours in Jerusalem include the old city, ultra-orthodox neighborhoods in west Jerusalem and Palestinian communities in East Jerusalem. Additionally, students will visit the northern borders of Israel, the Sea of Galilee and the Golan Heights where they will have the opportunity to engage with communities of Jewish, Christian and Muslim backgrounds.

**Faculty:** leading scholars and practitioners.

**Duration:** Two semesters (From October 2018 to June 2019).

**Tuition:** \$10,000 for the year. This special tuition rate will apply only for students that study in and complete the program in the academic year of 2018-19 (October 2018 to June 2019).

**Degree earned:** Master of Arts in Conflict Research Management & Resolution.

**Apply by:** June 30 th 2018; late applications reviewed on a case-by-case basis

**Program start date:** October 14, 2018.

**Admission requirements:** Students with a Bachelor's degree from accredited institutions of higher education are eligible for admission to the program. Admission is competitive and based on transcripts and grade-point average. Students should have a minimum GPA of 3.2 ("B"), 85% or equivalent.

**International Requirements:** If native language is not English or applicants have not previously studied at an institute of higher educational where the language of instruction is English they must submit official TOEFL or IELTS scores. The minimum TOEFL score required is 580 on the paper-based test, 230 on the computer-based test or 89 on the internet –based test. The minimum IELTS score is 7.
